



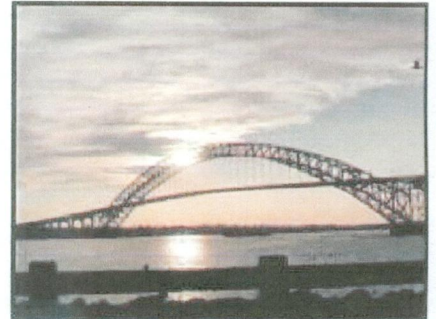

**In-Line Air Conditioning, Inc. Welcomes NJ's First Cruise Ship in 40 Years**

This past spring MCANJ member company In-Line Air Conditioning, Inc. and its sister company In-Line Metal Fabricators, Inc. was awarded the HVAC contract for the Royal Caribbean temporary passenger facility in Bayonne, NJ. The facility was given the name "Cape Liberty" by Royal Caribbean and is located on the Peninsula at Bayonne Harbor which is owned and managed by the Bayonne Local Redevelopment Authority.



This project is extremely important, as it represented the first cruise ship to sail out of a N.J. Port in over 40 years. The City of Bayonne was an extremely advantageous location for Royal Caribbean due to its close proximity to Newark Airport, New York City, and all major highways. In addition, the Cape Liberty Cruise Port cut out 45 additional minutes of "steaming" time if it were to dock in midtown New York City. It was officially opened in a May ceremony attended by former Gov. James McGreevy and other high ranking state officials.

The project involved many different building trades - Union carpenters, electricians, plumbers, painters and insulators working under project management from CH2M Hill Company. In-Line employed Local 274 pipefitters and Local 25 sheet metal tradesmen, who all worked very hard to get the fast track project completed. In a three month period, In-Line was responsible for the installation of approximately 375 tons of air conditioning equipment and ductwork. It was also the first time In-Line used fabric ductsox inside the terminal, which worked out very well.

It was truly an awesome sight to see the first of two cruise ships floating up to the port for the first time. In three months time, the professional skills of Union labor turned

four hundred thousand square feet of empty warehouse space into a fully functional world class terminal. According to Royal Caribbean, over 200,000 passengers traveled through the terminal this summer. The New Jersey location has proven to be a great success and we look forward to more cruise ships making Bayonne, N.J. their home port in the near future.
